

Somerset Gas Bear Print Pipeline

Bear Print Pipeline is located in the heart of the Marcellus shale fairway and serves gas production areas in north central Pennsylvania, spanning from Lewis Run to Renovo. The gathering system currently consists of approximately 56 miles of gathering pipeline and dissects Clinton, Cameron and McKean Counties. After acquiring Columbia Gas Transmission's (TCO) 1818/1862 system, Somerset Gas Gathering (SGG) re-named and re-commissioned the system "Bear Print Pipeline" as an unregulated gas gathering system. Bear Print,

- crosses every major interstate pipeline that serves the New England, Northeast and Mid-Atlantic Markets;
- has existing interconnections with Columbia Gas Transmission (TCO) and Tennessee Gas Pipeline Company (TGP);
- has multi-directional flow, allows for easier access to a various downstream markets;
- has a capacity of up to 60-80 MMcfd;
- maintains land rights in most parcels to develop a second parallel pipeline;
- has an expansion potential to 150 MMcfd;



SGG's business strategy is to utilize, to the extent possible, existing pipeline corridors to develop new pipelines to serve growing markets in the Northeast. This approach helps reduce the cost of the projects and most importantly, generally has the least amount of impact on the environment and landowners.

SGG is well funded and has capital commitments in excess of \$160 million to build midstream assets for production in the Appalachian region.
